ASAP: Review the Composite Letter Process

If you have not yet read through the instructions for the composite letter process, it is your responsibility to understand the process. Additionally, we do have sample composite letters, but because these are confidential, please let your composite writer know to reach out to HPP directly to get access to the samples.

Information About PrivateFolio

- <u>PrivateFolio</u> is where ONLY YOUR SUPPORT WRITERS upload their letters. Your composite writer
 will send their composite directly to HPP. After we've reviewed and finalized it, HPP will upload
 your Composite Letter of Evaluation Packet to PrivateFolio.
- You DO NEED to upload your autobiographical sketch, resume, and transcript to PrivateFolio. HPP will include these in your letter file which we send to your composite writer. It is also helpful for HPP to have these materials as a reference when reviewing your composite letter.
- When all your support letters are uploaded to PrivateFolio, you will submit the <u>Release to Composite Writer Form</u>. This will prompt HPP to compile your letter file (plus your autobiographical sketch, resume, and transcript) and send it to your composite writer.

Writing the Autobiographical Sketch

Your autobiographical sketch is useful to all of your writers, giving them more context and insight into your aspiration and preparation for applying to medical school. This can aid their writing as they advocate for your candidacy. For the support writers, the auto sketch is mostly to broaden their understanding of you. For the composite writer, it directly adds to their task of synthesizing the information they have about you from their own direct experience along with the information shared by you and your support writers. Overall, the composite writer provides context to your abilities, experiences, and who you are as a person. As such, your autobiographical sketch is an important resource for achieving this goal.

The self-reflection involved in this project is a great way to begin the reflection that is essential for the application itself. The format is flexible. You can write your auto sketch as an essay or in sections. You can choose your own relevant sections (ex. family influences, growing up, before college, academics, highlight experiences that were especially meaningful/relevant to your goals, highlight other experiences meaningful to you personally, why medicine, etc.).

Highlighting a few of your more meaningful and relevant experiences is very valuable. An auto sketch goes beyond the list that a resume presents and can better illustrate your engagement and/or the meaning, insights, and growth you may have gained. You can weave this information into your auto sketch or include it in a page attached to your sketch. This will also prepare you to write more deeply about your experiences for your application.

The autobiographical sketch can also be a place to share any unique challenges you may have experienced and wish your writers to understand. If you don't wish to share that with all your writers, add it for your composite writer, or have a thoughtful discussion with them. The composite writer can be called upon to provide context in unique circumstances. Feel free to discuss this with an advisor.

Additionally, brainstorm your composite list of work and activities as part of your application writing preparation, this will also help you with writing your auto sketch. Create a folder, document, or Excel spreadsheet, and start writing down every activity you can think of – whether or not you think it is relevant. Begin jotting down roles, responsibilities, insights, and specific moments. Some of this information may go into your auto sketch and will kick start your work and activities and essay writing for the application.

Self-Reflection and Questions to Consider:

Self-reflection is vital for the autobiographical sketch and for an excellent application. Consider the following questions:

- What were your formative experiences/values with your family, education, or community before college?
- What experiences/interests have you had over the years that have been meaningful to you? How have they shaped you?
- How have you grown academically and personally? Do you have any academic challenges to discuss?
- Have any classes you've taken had a significant impact on you? If so, in what way?
- Have you conducted research? How has it been meaningful to you?
- What extracurriculars or passions (music, athletics, etc.) are you involved in? How have they inspired or surprised you? What do you find meaningful about them?
- Have you engaged in certain themes in your studies or experiences (ex. working with children, the elderly, disadvantaged communities, etc., or researching autism, dementia, oncology, etc.)? If so, how did you become interested in this area? Why has this been such a significant part of your experience/studies? Why is this meaningful to you?
- What kind of service and/or health-related experiences have you had?
- Why do you want to study medicine/dentistry? What has influenced and affirmed this choice? Who has influenced or inspired you?
